In this difficult housing market, we concentrate our resources where they will have the greatest impact. The buying power of Habitat homeowners has barely increased while the cost of the homes has dramatically increased. In response, Habitat now funds additional down payment assistance to make up this gap and keep our homes affordable. Our work doesn't end there, we are securing futures through our Home Improvement Program and Community Development efforts. We work to keep people in their homes and able to pass those homes on.
